Dear Resurrection–St. Paul School Parents and Guardians,

As we approach re-enrollment for the 2026-2027 school year, I would like to thank you for your continued commitment to, and the faith you place in, Resurrection–St. Paul School (RSPS). Together, we continue to build on a strong foundation marked by full enrollment in many grades, ongoing investment in our facilities, and a shared focus on academic excellence, faith formation, and student well-being. Our mission has formed students in faith and learning for more than 100 years, and the Board takes our responsibility to steward school resources wisely, while protecting the long-term health of RSPS, very seriously, and we thank you for your on-going support.

The School Board, working closely with the school administration and upon the recommendation of the Board's Finance Committee, has approved the operating budget and tuition schedule for the 2026–2027 school year.

For the upcoming year, tuition will increase by 4.95%. In total dollar terms, for full-time students, this represents an increase of approximately \$445 to \$525 per student, depending on whether the Catholic rate or Other Faith rate applies and which of the three payment plans is selected. As in prior years, the dollar impact will be less for part-time students in Pre-K3 and Pre-K4.

In addition to tuition, three required fees will apply for the 2026–2027 school year:

- The Technology Fee of \$150 per student in 3rd-8th grade will continue. This fee supports 1:1 Chromebooks and the necessary software licenses for their use.
- The Home and School Association (HSA) fee of \$20 per student fee (up to a maximum of \$60 per family) will continue. This fee will be used to offset the cost of the numerous programs, events and services that the HSA provides to our school.
- A new Security Fee of \$175 per student will be introduced. This fee, which amounts to approximately \$1 a day per student, will help offset the cost associated with adding campus security personnel.

We recognize that any increase represents a real sacrifice for families. As in past years, both the Church of the Resurrection and St. Paul parishes, along with other supporting parishes, provide tuition assistance to families who qualify. If this tuition increase or the associated fees present a financial challenge for your family, we strongly encourage you to apply for assistance through the FACTS Grant & Aid program. Applications must be completed, with all documentation submitted and verified, by February 28, 2026. The application fee is \$35.00, and the application can be accessed through your FACTS account.



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The approved budget and tuition increases reflect ongoing shifts in the financial responsibilities borne by Catholic schools, including increased participation in utilities, maintenance, and extraordinary repairs, as outlined in agreements with the host parish and the Archdiocese of Baltimore. Long-term capital planning continues to be guided by the Archdiocese's Facility Condition Assessment.

The School Board remains firmly committed to prudent financial stewardship, seeking additional sources of revenue, and supporting the administration in maintaining a high-quality Catholic education while remaining mindful of the sacrifices families make. We are deeply grateful for the many ways parents support RSPS—through volunteerism, parish engagement, and your trust in our shared mission.
